To: All Applicants for a Land Management Burn

The following will be required for all applicants:

- 1. Shall make request in writing on company letterhead.
- 2. Shall complete the "Notification of Application Permit to Carry Out a Land Management Burn", all parties within 500 feet of the burn area shall be notified.
- 3. Shall notify the EPA, Bureau of Air, (217-782-2113) to obtain a State EPA Burn Permit, (if applicable).
- 4. Shall include a map(s) of areas to be burned.
- 5. Upon completion, please return to the Fire Department Administrative Office at the above address. A review will be completed prior to issuance of the requested burn permit.

- The permit may be revoked at any time if it has been determined that proper notification has not been completed.
- It has been our experience that this communication is an effective way of informing your neighbors of any open burning activity and maintaining a good neighbor policy.

Special Conditions:

- Burning is allowed from 10:00AM until 3:00PM.
- Wind speed shall not exceed 10 MPH as measured at the DuPage Co. Airport.
- The burn shall be attended at all times by an agent of the permit holder.
- An appropriate method(s) of extinguishment shall be available on the site.
- Burning shall not create a smoke nuisance or hazard to neighboring properties, persons, roads or highways. Notification of all neighbors within 500' of burn is required.
- Burning shall not take place on any days where the air quality index is "orange" or worse, as given on the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's website.
- Adequate clearance (firebreak) shall be provided to separate the area to be burned from all other areas, located a minimum of 50 feet from any structure.
- The permit holder shall cease burning when any of the above conditions are not met.
