6. Committee Reports.

A. Education and Outreach.

Comm. Myers provided a recap of the four recent NRC-sponsored bird walks: over 100 members of the community attended the bird walks, and the last bird walk on May 10th had approximately 40 participants including several high school students. The NRC will sponsor bird walks again next year.

Mr. Reineking informed the Commission the two Bird City signs awarded to the City have been installed at the north and south city gateways on Rt. 31 [near Boy Scout Island to the north and Roosevelt Street to the south].

i. Fox River Dam Joint Task Force Update.

The NRC liaisons to the Fox River Dam Joint Task Force [Task Force], Comms. Churchill, Haggas and Mengler reported on the last Task Force meeting held on June 6th and noted:

- Some of the sub-committees have suggested more studies may be needed
- The impact of the dam removal on water level of the river was discussed
- Consideration for the environment and wildlife was not discussed
- The Task Force website is very comprehensive: https://engage.stcharlesil.gov/fox-river-dam?tool=qanda
- The impact on the paddle boats at Pottawatomie Park was discussed
- The City Council, not the Task Force, will decide the future of the dam

Comm. Mengler would like to recommend having representatives from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers attend one of the Task Force meetings to provide additional information and answer questions.

Comm. Otto suggested providing videos to the Task Force of sites where dams have been successfully removed on the Fox River, and suggested focusing on the ecology of the river.

The NRC liaisons will request feedback on the letter sent May 16th from Comm. Mengler on behalf of the NRC to Task Force Chair. Jim Cooke.

The NRC liaisons will request time on the Task Force's agenda to discuss the NRC's recommendations.

The next Task Force meeting is scheduled for July 11th, the same evening as the NRC's regular July meeting. At the request of Chair. Nagy, the NRC agreed to meet on Wednesday, July 17th instead of the second Thursday of the month.
